PURPOSE OF THE STRATEGY

The Rural Support Service Strategy is a new initiative, and has a 2 year outlook from July 2020 to June 2022. The Rural Strategy provides a short-term framework for how Desert Blue Connect and the communities in the North Midlands work together to advance a shared goal of optimised health, safety and well-being of all people. This Rural Strategy outlines what we will do as a community organisation and how we will go about it.

The Rural Strategy also provides a clear approach to measuring progress towards meeting these goals.



HOW THE RURAL STRATEGY WAS DEVELOPED

The Rural Strategy was developed through community and stakeholder engagement

Those who contributed provided us with key areas of need, what was already working in the community and other great ideas. The feedback has provided a framework for how we can work and live together in a strong community where everyone thrives.

We had various methods of engagement during 2019 across the communities in the North Midlands region.

We connected through:

- Stalls and surveys at the Mingenew Expo
- Stalls and questionnaires at the Perenjori Show
- Meetings with key people at all the local Shires
- Local Community Resource Centres
- Pop up stalls at other local events
- Social media
- School communities
- Key stakeholders i.e. police, teachers, health workers, community development officers



WHO WE ARE

Desert Blue Connect is a not for profit organisation based in Geraldton that provides services across the Midwest and Gascoyne region of Western Australia. These include women's health services, family violence support and counselling, crisis accommodation for women and children, sexual assault counselling, a men's intervention service, community and school based education programs and rural support services. Desert Blue Connect is a regional leader in family violence prevention and response and has a strong community and women's health agenda with a suite of services. We have a rural office in Morawa and three locations in Geraldton: a men's service, a women's refuge and the main town office.

Our focus

Is to provide an inclusive, safe and comfortable environment for the holistic health and wellbeing of our community.



WHAT DOES DESERT BLUE CONNECT ALREADY DO IN THE NORTH MIDLANDS REGION?

Counselling services to the North Midlands region have been provided for many years by the Northern Districts Community Support Group (Morawa Counselling Services). This service is now part of Desert Blue Connect and continues to be offered from the Morawa office and other locations in the various towns.

Now known as the Rural Support Services, confidential counselling services are available to men and women across the Shires of Morawa, Mingenew, Three Springs, Carnamah, Coorow and Perenjori. Our suite of services include counselling for anxiety and depression, stress, grief and loss, self-esteem, and personal, family or relationships issues.

A Rural Services Coordinator works alongside the counsellor and coordinates outreach services to the community. These consist of Desert Blue Connect's specialist services in the areas of health, family violence, sexual assault and prevention and other visiting practitioners and services.

RURAL SUPPORT SERVICES

5 PRIORITY AREAS

1. Mental health and wellness

- Provide mental health promotion and primary prevention activity that support rural people's needs.
- Support access to rural counselling services.
- Raise awareness and embed practices to reduce stigma and discrimination associated with mental ill-health.

2. Men's health promotion

- Provide men's health promotion activity to enhance and support rural men.

3. Family support

- Provide support and education to parents and families.

4. Partnership approaches

- Enhance coordinated and collaborative approaches within the regions, where Desert Blue Connect and other partners work to improve the health and well-being of people residing in all communities in the rural shires. Key relationships in the community are health services, the 7 shires, school communities, police, sport and business.

5. Provision of Desert Blue Connect outreach services

- Increase outreach services (Desert Blue Connect core services) to rural region, addressing key health gaps and emerging issues.
- Increase awareness and access to Desert Blue Connect core services in the rural region through regular promotion and communication.





Priority area 1

Mental health and wellness

GOALS

Increased understanding of the importance of factors that lead to good mental health and well being, as recorded by feedback.

Increase in the number of people accessing rural counselling and referrals to other mental health services, as measured by counsellor data.

An increase in educational opportunities to decrease stigma and discrimination associated with mental health.

Engaged rural communities who have increased awareness of the ways that resilience and mental well-being can be promoted.

At risk families and individuals are able to resolve crises and promote the safety and wellbeing of themselves and their family members.





Provide mental health promotion and primary prevention activity to enhance and support rural people

Develop new targeted mental health promotion activities and programs

Development of additional programs with stakeholders as needed, i.e. adult literacy.

Collaborate with existing stakeholders to strengthen mental health education and promote opportunities to screen at risk people

Participation in community events (i.e. Mingenew Expo, Perenjori show) to provide educational resources, mental health checklists and referral options.

Collaborate with WAPHA, North Midlands Project, police and other partners in existing mental health and suicide prevention activities in the region.

Develop tailored education and awareness materials for community

Communications plan to include social media, feature articles, targeted advertising, and print flyers, cards and posters

Support and increase access to rural counselling services

Communications plan to include advertising local newspapers and magazines, school newsletters, local papers, rural and agricultural printed resources, and other printed materials.

Investigate and introduce new formats of service delivery (i.e. phone and video counselling)

Develop tailored education and awareness resources

Webinars and educational videos on counselling tips, good mental health, dispel myths and stigma around mental health.

Promote culturally and linguistically appropriate resources for different demographics within the communities.



Priority area 2

Men's health promotion in rural communities

GOALS

Increase in educational opportunities to improve men's health.

Improved knowledge of factors that lead to good health and well-being.

A greater awareness, by men, of local resources for health support available.





Provide men's health promotion activity to enhance and support rural men

Increase the knowledge and skills necessary to choose a healthy lifestyle

Provide gendered resources, guidance, support and information regarding referral pathways to men.

All men across the 7 shires, including priority groups (Aboriginal, CaLD, youth, carers, disability and elderly).

Education via rural print newspapers

Develop new community programs and events by Desert Blue Connect or in partnership with existing men's health promotion occurring in the region.

Provide men's health week activities annually.

Partnership with Checkmate.

Partnership with Rural Men's Health to hold events and health talks for men.

Collaboration with other mental health agencies such as RUOK and Beyond Blue.



Priority area 3

Family support for rural families

GOALS

New programs introduced across 7 shires that support parents, caregivers and families. Improved accessibility of information and education for parents.

Parents and caregivers have increased knowledge of parenting strategies to provide a nurturing, safe and positive home environment to raise their children.

At risk families and individuals are able to resolve crises and promote the safety and wellbeing of themselves and their family members.





Provide support and education to parents, caregivers and families

New Desert Blue Connect programs are introduced into the regions that support parents and families and provide strategies to improve child health and wellbeing outcomes.

Develop additional targeted programs as required, to address the specific health, wellbeing and social needs of children and their parents/caregivers.

Introduce Resilience Group for children after school according to identified need.

A special parents and caregivers day/community event is held once per year in rural region.

Develop support services and programs in line with emerging issues.

Delivery of parent/caregiver information and education program using a variety of methods, focusing on improving parenting literacy and Desert Blue Connect key children's services areas.

Development of the parent and caregiver information and education program to include;

Email newsletter for Desert Blue Connect - across 7 shires.

Educational videos.

Articles for inclusion in school newsletters (sexual abuse prevention, family violence and child safety, resilience, relationships, parenting, e-safety)

Culturally sensitive and appropriate resources.



Priority area 4

Partnership approaches

GOALS

Established partnership with all shires and/or regular meetings take place with shire personnel across the region.

Memo of Understanding's and other partnership arrangements are established as needed.

Increase in stakeholder partnerships (i.e. Aboriginal organisations, mining companies, other employers and businesses).





Enhance co-ordinated and collaborative approaches within the rural region. Desert Blue Connect and other partners work to improve the health and wellbeing of people residing in all communities in the 7 shires through key relationships in the community and health services, schools, police, sport and business.

Establish regional partnerships with 7 shires to develop local solutions to better meet the health and wellbeing needs of communities.

Desert Blue Connect staff regularly participate at community shire meetings.

Work collaboratively with shire events and activities.

Increase relationships with Aboriginal partners and Aboriginal Controlled Organisations across the 7 shires.

Desert Blue Connect participates in key significant Aboriginal cultural days.

Regular liaising as part of stakeholder plan in line with Reconciliation Action Plan.

Co-design education and awareness materials and programs with Aboriginal communities.

Desert Blue Connect to work collaboratively with health, community services, child and family services, aged care, housing, alcohol and other drugs, Aboriginal groups, school communities, police, sport and business.

Develop a rural counsellor and stakeholder plan to cover rural region of 7 shires, with regular scheduled visits.

Coordinate stakeholder engagement between Desert Blue Connect outreach professionals and rural stakeholders.



Priority area 5

Desert Blue Connect outreach services

GOALS

Women's Health

Women have greater awareness of resources that can be accessed to assist in meeting health challenges, make healthy choices and have greater awareness of social determinants of women's health.

Health professionals have increased knowledge of gender specific health issues in the diverse population and increased knowledge to support women to respond to health needs.

Sexual assault

People have a greater understanding of sexual assault and abuse, how they can protect themselves or seek help as needed and how to make their communities safer for everyone.

Other

Increase in knowledge and positive health and social outcomes from other Desert Blue Connect programs (i.e. family violence prevention and response education, financial support).

Increase in the number of services available and ability for populations in all shires to access at least one of these.



Increase core outreach services to rural region, addressing key health gaps and emerging issues.

Desert Blue Connect Community Initiative Team will collaborate to strengthen outreach service provision to rural region.

Support the provision of regular activities and services as identified for outreach services (i.e. women's health promotion days, child safe workshops for parents, sexual assault prevention, e-safety workshops at schools.

Regular activities supported by Geraldton based Desert Blue Connect team members.

Develop new and additional programs and offer them in rural region according to identified need.

Training staff and development of new programs (financial program, understanding family violence workshop, explore new groups to provide sexual assault prevent series workshops.

Participate in Aboriginal activities and collaborations

NAIDOC week involvement and planning.

Monitor community issues and respond accordingly

Address identified needs and issues, work collaboratively with main Desert Blue Connect office, local agencies and community to provide appropriate outreach service responses.

Collaborate with other local programs that work to improve health and wellbeing of rural people.

Increase awareness and access to Geraldton based Desert Blue Connect services in rural region through regular promotion and communication.

Develop a communications plan

Plan to include promotion of core Desert Blue Connect services in Geraldton and via outreach to rural regions.

Support key professionals with promotion and coordination in the region.

Increase stakeholder and client awareness

Educate local services so they can recognise and respond to identified needs within the community and refer to Desert Blue Connect outreach services.
